ADVISORY ASSIGNMENTS: All students will report to Advisory on the first day of school, Wednesday, August 16 at 7:20am. **This includes students who have late arrival or Lone Star Montgomery College courses.** After Advisory, students with late arrival will report to the cafeteria. Advisory assignments are based on “grade level” classification and will be posted throughout both campuses. The CISD School Board has established credit requirements for classifications. The following classification system is used only for academic placement and “Advisory” placement.

Sophomore: 6 – 11.5 credits

Junior: 12 –17.5 credits

Senior: 18 –26 credits

Please expect your student to bring home a student insurance form and a PTO membership application. If you are interested in student insurance, you must sign-up for it at this time and return the form with the other information. All of the other previous forms that used to come home have been converted to electronic. The Student Handbook will be available electronically unless you request a hard copy

NINTH GRADE CAMPUS INFORMATION: All freshman students will need to report to TWHS Ninth Grade Campus on Wednesday, August 16, regardless if their class first and fifth period is at the Senior Campus or off campus. Students will report directly to their Advisory classes by 7:20 am on Wednesday. Advisory student assignments will be posted throughout the building. Because all students are reporting to the Ninth Grade Campus on the first day of school, car riders should plan on longer travel time before school due to the extra traffic in the drop off line.

There will be no shuttles running between TWHS and TWHS Ninth Grade Campus during the school day on Wednesday, August 16. Freshman will remain at TWHS Ninth Grade Campus all day on Wednesday. Class period shuttles will start running on Thursday, August 17. After school shuttles will run from the Ninth Grade Campus to the Senior Campus beginning the first day of school after dismissal.

Students will be dismissed 10-minutes early (2:25 pm) on Wednesday and Thursday for the purpose of providing bus riders extra time to find their busses. Starting on Friday, students will be dismissed at 2:35 pm.

ATTENDANCE: Welcome to the 2017-2018 school year! Please take a moment to review the attendance procedures we feel will ensure a smooth, successful year.

TWHS classes begin at 7:20 a.m. and are dismissed at 2:35 p.m. Students who arrive between 7:21 and 7:35 are considered tardy. Those who arrive at 7:36, or later, are considered absent from their first class of the day. Please remember, students who arrive at school after 7:35 need to check in through the Attendance Office and have a parent note (or phone call) providing a reason for the absence.

Parking privileges are affected by 1st/5th period (2nd/6th for late arrival students) tardies and unexcused absences. Five-day parking privilege suspensions will be levied after five tardies or three unexcused absences for those periods.

Absences not covered by a parent note or call will be considered Unexcused after two days. To report an absence, please call:

If it's necessary for your student to leave campus prior to the 2:35 dismissal time, please send a note with them in the morning, stating the time they need to check out and the reason for leaving. He or she will exchange the parent note for a Permit to Leave form, in the Attendance Office, upon arrival in the morning, between classes or during lunch. Juniors and Seniors who drive to school may check themselves out provided they have a parent note authorizing them to do so. By making arrangements in advance, we are able to minimize disruption of class instruction and provide an efficient check out at your designated time.

A full explanation of policies concerning attendance can be found in the TWHS Student/Parent handbook. The Attendance Office staff will happily answer any questions and assist you with any attendance related concerns. Feel free to call the numbers above at any time. You may leave a message if you call outside of the 7:00 to 3:00 office hours.

RED/GREEN DAY SCHEDULE: The Woodlands High School uses the Red/Green schedule. A school calendar listing red and green calendar days is posted on TWHS website. Students will have 8 classes with periods 1-4 on Red days and periods 5-8 on Green days. Advisory classes will meet on Wednesdays and Thursdays. ONLINE STUDENT REGISTRATION/DATA VALIDATION SYSTEM FOR 2017-18: The Conroe Independent School District is excited to announce an online student registration/data validation system for the upcoming school year, powered by InfoSnap. The system is a secure and green process, which allows the district to verify all student demographic, emergency and medical information for your child prior to the start of the new school year. This first year, you will need to enter information that we do not currently have in digital form, such as your student’s Health Information form. This online process replaces all the hard copy student registration forms that your child brings home on the first day of school.

When it is time to fill out the online form, you will receive an email from the Conroe Independent School District with instructions on how to access the system for your student. The email will contain a link and a secure “snapcode” that links directly to your student’s information. You will create an account, that you will use each year for this process, and submit a form for each student in your family. To make the process easier for families with multiple students, you will have the option to copy all generic family information to all other students in your family.

We would appreciate all families to take action and complete these forms as soon as possible after receiving the letter/email. Your student’s registration will not be complete until the forms have been submitted. If you do not have access to the Internet, there will be computers available at the school to complete the forms.

We are very excited to bring this new process to the District. We believe that you will find it is a much easier way to update your student’s information each year.
