There is also lots of information on the front page of Naviance/Family Connection including upcoming scholarship deadlines for all grades, scroll through and read that, as I will update as they come in.

Colleges continue to visit the College and Career Center daily, so juniors and seniors, be sure and sign up through your Naviance/Family Connection account to visit with the college reps that are here on campus. These are often the people who will read your college applications, so it is a great idea to meet them in person.

**Financial Aid Night/FAFSA/CSS Profile Night** is Thursday, September 28th at 7:00 PM in the Auditorium. It is very important that seniors and a parent attend. Even if you do not think that you will qualify for financial aid, it is in your best interest to fill out the FAFSA and/or CSS Profile if your college requires it because there are merit-based scholarships that you will not qualify for if the FAFSA has not been completed (whether you get any need-based aid or not). If you are unable to attend, ask a friend to take notes for you. Or, Conroe High School will hold their Financial Aid night on September 26th from 6-8 in their LGI.

The FAFSA opens on October 1st at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). Do not ever pay to submit the FAFSA, it is FREE. The sooner you submit, the more likely you are to get aid, as the aid starts running out as more people apply. CSS Profile also opens October 1st through College Board.

**The Conroe ISD College Fair** at Lone Star Convention Center is October 2nd from 6:30-8:30, it is a come and go event with over 150 colleges and universities represented.

**Seniors**, please continue to work on your applications and get them completed. The College and Career Center is open and here to help all day, before and after school, during late arrival and early release, during lunch, and during advisory with a pass. Even if your deadlines are not until later in the spring, the sooner you can get your applications the better, as scholarship deadlines are often earlier than application deadlines and you must have completed your application in order to qualify for university scholarships.

Always check your university websites for their scholarships as each school will offer scholarships, but you will often have to apply separately for them.

Make sure that you have paid any application fees, sent your test scores from College Board and ACT to each college that you have applied to, and sent any other documents necessary. Be sure **after** you have completed your applications that you send a transcript to each school that you apply to by going into Family Connection, going to the Colleges tab and clicking on Transcripts.

**Juniors**, please use this year wisely, and be looking at colleges using Naviance/Family Connection, visiting the college's websites, taking college visits, and taking your SAT [www.collegeboard.org](http://www.collegeboard.org) and ACT [www.act.org](http://www.act.org). It is best if you have the scores that you want by the end of this year, and you may need to take each test at least 2 times to get that score, so start testing soon. Use [www.khanacademy.org](http://www.khanacademy.org) to study or sign up for one of CISD's prep classes by visiting <http://www.conroeisd.net/departments/guidance-counseling/college-readiness-information/>. Each time that you take a test you can send your scores to 4 schools for free, every college rep we have talked to has said, SEND YOUR SCORES WHEN YOU TEST, do not delay, by waiting to see them, and then having to pay for them. The colleges will take your best scores, and some will even superscore and take your best score from multiple tests, so it is in your best interest to send all scores. If you are concerned about this, please talk to me about it before the test, but waiting to send your scores until senior year is definitely not a good idea because it may delay your application or scholarship application to a point where you miss a deadline.

**EVENING TUTORIALS:** Evening tutorials are offered by TWHS faculty for students who need help in math, science, and Spanish. Math tutorials are offered Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. Spanish tutorials are offered Monday. Science tutorials are offered Tuesday and Thursday. Students should bring their textbook, class notes, and any other necessary supplies to use while working on homework or preparing for a test. Evening tutorials are located in classroom 201. The classroom opens at 5:30 PM and closes at 7:30 PM. Students will need to sign in and present their ID upon arrival. Cell phone use should not occur during tutorials.
