NINTH GRADE PSAT: For your child's convenience, the PSAT will be offered at the Ninth Grade Campus on Wednesday, October 10, during the school day. The PSAT/NMSQT is the Preliminary SAT test. The PSAT test is optional and available to all interested freshmen. It is recommended for students who are currently enrolled in geometry or algebra II as freshmen. The cost of the test is \$17. The Woodlands High School has purchased a limited number of exams for freshmen to take. Registration will continue through September 26, or until all exams have been sold. PARKING LOT SAFETY: Please note that the posted speed limit on the TWHS property is 10 MPH. Please be sure to observe the speed limit as well follow traffic rules such as stopping at intersections and cross paths on the property as well as using blinkers when turning into parking spaces and pathways.

PSAT SCHEDULE – TESTING NEWS: The PSAT will be administered to all sophomores and juniors free of charge and to freshmen who have registered and paid the \$17.00 fee on Wednesday, October 10, 2018. A study guide for this test will be given to student on both campuses the week of September 10th. Any student who did not receive a guide can pick one up in the grade level office at the senior campus and in the counseling office at the 9th grade campus.

The PSAT evaluates students on reading, writing and math. Part of the math section must be taken WITHOUT a calculator. See page 26 of the student guide for more details. In addition, TWHS will not provide calculators on the day of the test. Students must bring their own and it must be acceptable according to the guidelines listed on page 26 of the student guide if they wish to use it on the test.

To avoid a cancelled score, please review with your child the testing guidelines located on pages 4-6 of the student guide. On average, students who take the PSAT in 10th and 11th grade score 155 points higher on the SAT. There is a practice test with answers located inside the guide. Additional practice questions and study strategies can be found at collegeboard.org/psatpractice. Students may also prepare by using the Khan Academy at www.khanacademy.org Good luck Highlanders!

The District is required by Title VI and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Americans with Disabilities Act, as well as Board policy not to discriminate in such a manner.
