NINTH GRADE CAMPUS PSAT SCHEDULE – The Ninth Grade Campus will be on the following bell schedule for the PSAT on Wednesday, October 10. All freshmen need to report to the Ninth Grade Campus by 7:20 am. Car riders should allow more time in the morning due to the extra traffic. Because this year's PSAT is a longer test and freshmen have to bubble their answer keys, the Ninth Grade Campus bell schedule is different from the Senior Campus. Over half of the freshmen will be in their regularly scheduled classes at the times listed below. Over 400 freshmen will be taking the PSAT in their assigned testing rooms. Students assigned to take the PSAT will look at posters in the hallways to find their designated testing rooms. All students will remain on the Ninth Grade Campus for third period classes after the PSAT. Shuttles to the Senior Campus will run for 4th period classes and after school.

SENIOR CAMPUS PSAT TESTING NEWS: Just a reminder that PSAT will be administered on Wednesday, October 10, 2018 at the Woodlands High School senior campus to sophomores and juniors free of charge and to freshmen who have registered and paid the \$17.00 fee at the ninth grade campus. Seniors will be taking their panoramic picture on PSAT test day, Wednesday, October 10th. **They should report to school at 10:00** instead of 11:20 as previously stated. At the senior campus, there will be three lunches this day instead of four, so students are encouraged to bring their lunch to avoid long lines in the cafeteria.

Please note the following:

1. The use of highlighters, mechanical pencils and dictionaries are not allowed on PSAT.
2. **TWHS will not provide calculators for the math section.** Student must bring their own. Reference your study guide for approved calculators on p. 27.
3. Students will not be allowed access to smartphones and smart watches during the test.

SPECIAL GUEST from COLUMBIA UNIVERSITY: On October 22 Dr. Michael Massimino will be in the LGI at 3pm for a special lecture. Please join us! Dr. Massimino’s bio:

Michael Massimino is a Professor in the Department of Mechanical Engineering at Columbia University’s The Fu Foundation School of Engineering and Applied Science and the Senior Advisor of Space Programs at the Intrepid Sea, Air, and Space Museum.

He received his Bachelor of Science from Columbia Engineering and Masters of Science in both Mechanical Engineering and Technology and Policy, as well as his PhD in Mechanical Engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Dr. Massimino was selected as an astronaut candidate by NASA in 1996. A veteran of two space flights, the fourth and fifth Hubble Space Telescope servicing missions in 2002 and 2009, Dr. Massimino has many accomplishments in space including a team record for the number of hours spacewalking in a single space shuttle mission. He was also the first person to tweet from space.

Back at his alma mater, Columbia, Dr. Massimino is teaching an undergraduate course, Introduction to Human Space Flight, which harnesses his years of academic and professional experience. He is also working with The Art of Engineering, a course in which all first-year engineers attend design lectures and work on engineering projects with socially responsible themes.

You may wonder why his name looks so familiar. When not in academia or at NASA, Dr. Massimino has made several television appearances including a recurring role as himself on the CBS hit comedy, “The Big Bang Theory.” He is also the host of the Science Channel’s series “The Planets” and frequently appears on national and cable news. And on top of that, his book, the New York Times Bestseller, “Spaceman: An Astronaut’s Unlikely Journey to Unlock the Secrets of the Universe”, was released in fall 2016 and just came out in paperback.

PSAT SCHEDULE – TESTING NEWS: The PSAT will be administered to all sophomores and juniors free of charge and to freshmen who have registered and paid the \$17.00 fee on Wednesday, October 10, 2018. A study guide for this test will be given to students on both campuses the week of September 10th. Any student who did not receive a guide can pick one up in the grade level office at the senior campus and in the counseling office at the 9th grade campus.

The PSAT evaluates students on reading, writing and math. Part of the math section must be taken **WITHOUT** a calculator. See page 26 of the student guide for more details. In addition, TWHS will not provide calculators on the day of the test. Students must bring their own and it must be acceptable according to the guidelines listed on page 26 of the student guide if they wish to use it on the test.

To avoid a cancelled score, please review with your child the testing guidelines located on pages 4-6 of the student guide. On average, students who take the PSAT in 10th and 11th grade score 155 points higher on the SAT. There is a practice test with answers located inside the guide. Additional practice questions and study strategies can be found at collegeboard.org/psatpractice. Students may also prepare by using the Khan Academy at www.khanacademy.org Good luck Highlanders!

SCHOOL NEWS:

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMS: Advanced placement exams are now available for purchase through the School Cash Online System. These exams are **not** for students in PreAP

classes. The cost of each exam is \$96. The free and reduced price is \$55 per exam (students must be registered in the Federal Free or Reduced Program).

This year, exam registration is a two part process. Students must enroll in the appropriate classes online at myap.collegeboard.org and pay for their exam(s) through the new TWHS Web Store. All purchases must be made through the webstore. Enrollment codes will be provided by the AP teachers.

Deadline to complete this process for Fall Semester classes and self study exams without a late fee is November 9, 2018. After this date, there is a \$40 late fee assessed by College Board.

*Students enrolled in Spring Semester classes such as AP Psychology, AP US Government, AP Economics, and AP Human Geography will pay and register online in the spring without penalty.

*If students wish to take an Advanced Placement exam for a class they are not taking this school year, 2018-2019, (self study) they must see Mrs. Shepard, Assistant Principal, in the Grade Level Office for the Exam Only enrollment code and pay for the exam online by November 9, 2018, to avoid late fees.
