COUNSELOR’S CORNER:

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMS: Advanced placement exams are now available for purchase through the School Cash Online System. These exams are **not** for students in PreAP classes. The cost of each exam is \$96. The free and reduced price is \$55 per exam (students must be registered in the Federal Free or Reduced Program to qualify for the).

This year, exam registration is a two part process. Students must enroll in the appropriate classes online at myap.collegeboard.org and pay for their exam(s) through the new TWHS Web Store. All purchases must be made through the webstore. Enrollment codes will be provided by the AP teachers.

Deadline to complete this process for Fall Semester classes and self study exams without a late fee is Nov 9, 2018. After this date, there is a \$40 late fee assessed by College Board.

*Students enrolled in Spring Semester classes such as AP Psychology, AP US Government, AP Economics, and AP Human Geography will pay and register online in the spring without penalty.

*If students wish to take an Advanced Placement exam for a class they are not taking this school year, 2018-2019, (self study) they must see Mrs. Shepard, Assistant Principal, in the Grade Level Office for the Exam Only enrollment code and pay for the exam online by Nov 9, 2018, to avoid late fees.

SOPHOMORE GUIDANCE LESSONS: The counselors are doing presentations with all sophomores through their World History classes from Nov 5 - 16. During these interactive presentations, the students are updating their endorsement selection and four-year plan. In addition, we are having them login to their family connection accounts to learn about different careers through the career interest profiler. Most of the students should have plenty of time to complete their assessments during the class. If not, they were instructed to login and complete the assessment at home.

JUNIOR GUIDANCE LESSONS: The counselors are doing presentations with all juniors through their science classes (Physics and Principles of Technology) from Oct 22 - Nov 2. During these sessions, student will login to their family connections accounts to learn about the resources under the college tab. Students will also be exposed to various postsecondary options and given tools to assist them in their research. If students would like to retake any previous assessments such as the career interest profiler, the counselors will be able to reset their student accounts.

You should preview the questions that are asked on the FAFSA application so that you will know if you have the right federal income tax numbers that are needed.
