ACADEMICS:

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMS FINAL DEADLINE: The last day to register and purchase AP exams is Feb 22, 2019 at 3 P.M. These exams are not for students in PreAP classes.

Spring Semester Classes – Students enrolled in Spring Semester classes such as AP Psychology, AP US Government, AP Economics, and AP Human Geography on the senior campus will pay and register online in the spring without penalty. Your AP teacher will give you the Join code in class. You must pay for these exams by Feb 22, 2019. The cost of these exams is \$96 each. The free and reduced price is \$55 per exam (students must be registered in the Federal Free or Reduced Lunch Program to qualify for the reduced price). When accessing the School Cash Online website you must make sure to purchase the item titled 'Spring Semester Advanced Placement Test(s) - 2018/2019'.

Yearlong, Fall Semester, Self-Study* (Exam Only) – The initial deadline has passed. Each exam in these categories will be subject to the late fee imposed by College Board. The cost of these exams is \$96 + \$40 late fee. The free and reduced price is \$55 per exam + \$40 late fee (students must be registered in the Federal Free or Reduced Lunch Program to qualify for the reduced price). Students in this category must contact Mrs. Shepard in the Grade Level Office to finalize their exam order with CollegeBoard.

Remember that registration is a two-part process. Students must join the appropriate classes online at myap.collegeboard.org using the code provided by their AP teacher and pay for their exam(s) through the new TWHS Web Store. All purchases must be made through the TWHS School Cash Online website.

*If students wish to take an Advanced Placement exam for a class they are not taking this school year, 2018 - 2019, (self-study) they must see Mrs. Shepard, Assistant Principal, in the Grade Level Office for the Exam Only Join code and pay for the exam online through the TWHS School Cash Online website. These exams are subject to the \$40 late fee imposed by CollegeBoard.

CAREER PREP: JUNIORS: Are you thinking about your senior schedule? Do you already have a job in the community? Career Prep Education at TWHS may be something you consider! Career prep is available to seniors and is a work-based learning opportunity that combines classroom study with paid work experience. Learn relevant employability skills and leave high school with a capstone experience. Students receive instruction by participating in a Career Preparation classroom and training site experiences.

- 3 high school credits
- Student must average 15 hours of work at an approved work-site to receive high school credit
- Must be a 16+ year old senior

- Must have your own transportation. Students with Career Prep in their schedule have early release from school at 11:35 am daily.

Registration Information for the 2019 – 2020 School year:

Pre-Registration for 2019-2020 started with Blitz week, January 22nd through January 25th, 2019. During this week, all core teachers gave their advisements for their students. Parents and students will be able to see those advisements on their four year plan tab on Parent Access Center (PAC) and Student Access Center (SAC). In addition, elective teachers will also start to visit with students during this time about the various programs in their departments.

Step One for the Preregistration process is the paper course selection worksheet. Students in all grade levels were given a paper course selection worksheet through their English classes during the week of Jan. 28th through Feb. 1st. On these worksheets, students will be able to see what the course choices are for their upcoming grade level. For example, seniors have more choices of electives than the incoming sophomores and juniors.

Step Two for the Preregistration process involves the use of a computer, phone or tablet. The online registration window is open from January 28th, 2019 through February 8th, 2019. Students and parents will need to login to their Students Access Center (SAC) or their Parent Access Center (PAC) to complete the registration process online. The courses can be found under the 4 Yr Plan tab for each student. Step by step directions and screen shots for online registration can be found on TWHS main webpage (<http://twhs.conroeisd.net/>). **It is important to note that we will be using the courses in the 4 Yr Plan as the final course request.** The student’s paper copy will only be used as a resource to aide parents and students in the course selection process. Therefore, please make sure the courses in SAC or PAC are correct by **the course selection sheet deadline of February 8th, 2019.**

Upcoming Individual Student Conferences with their Counselors:

During the months of February and March, all of our current 9th -11th grade students will meet one on one with their school counselor to discuss next year's courses as well as their four year plans. Step One:

Please click on the following google document link to enter your scholarship information (Form will allow you to enter up to 10 scholarships). In order to fill out this google document, you will need this information:

1. Student ID (Your six digit lunch number)
2. Last Name
3. First Name
4. Full Name of Scholarship
5. Name of university, organization, or company that is providing the scholarship (Ex. Sam Houston State University, Touchdown Club, or JROTC)
6. Amount of Scholarship (For renewable scholarships for four years, include four year total in the blank.)

Step Two:

After submitting your google document, please go to CCC and turn in your scholarship documentation. Do not hand in your original copy of the award letter. Please only turn in copies.

Example: Bring copy of college award letter with name of scholarship(s) and the amount of awards. In addition, your name must be on this letter for verification. Please black out any identifying information such as grants, loans, or social security numbers. Our campus only needs to see the information that is pertinent to the scholarship or award. On top of the letter, you will need to fill out a brief form that will verify you submitted your google document online, along with your Student ID number and your name. Remember to print legibly on the form! If you get additional scholarships or awards later on in the year, simply repeat the process listed above.

Deadlines for Submission of Scholarships:

First Deadline: **May 2nd, 2019** for your award to be in the main body of the program

Second Deadline: **May 9th, 2019** for your award to be in the addendum of the program

OTHER NEWS:

TWHS CLINIC: We have confirmed cases of Flu virus in our campus. The flu virus is a respiratory viral illness, spread by air (breathing in particles from an infected person's cough or sneezes) or by hand (touching an infected person or object then touching the mouth or nose). PLEASE BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR POSSIBLE SIGNS IN YOUR CHILD AND KEEP THEM HOME TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF VIRUS. The number one way to prevent flu is get vaccinated, it is not too late. Another effective way to prevent flu is practicing good hand washing to keep germs away.

If your child has a fever over 100 degrees, he or she must stay out of school until they are fever free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medications. Students with diarrheal
